

## Medieval Report

Here is an outline of what will be required for your medieval report. The report will consist of two parts: a Written Report and an Oral Report.

### Written Report:

Cover Sheet with coat of arms, name, date project is due, and guild / family name

Three to four pages in length.

Times New Roman font 12 point

Double Spaced

10 works cited, alphabetized – minimum 5 book sources and 5 internet sources.

### Written Report Format:

#### Intro:

Introduce yourself as if you were from medieval times. State your age, the year, place you where you are, the king, and who is in charge of your land. Write a short description of your family and guild.

#### Body:

##### Family

Who lives in your house – relatives, siblings, wife, children

What you eat

What types of clothing you wear

Where your house is located – near a river or castle

Are you married? How many children you have, and their ages

Do you have siblings, alive or dead?

Your have extended family, alive or dead

Daily routine

Medicine – usage and problems

##### Guild

What guild you are in

How long you have been a part of the guild

Do you enjoy the guild and your work?

What is your position?

How do you travel to fairs and the market to sell your product?

How do you do your work?

What materials do you use?

How do you work with other members of your guild?

Is your guild successful? Why or why not?

What do other guilds think of your guild?

Conclusion:

What does the future look like for your family and guild? What are your expectations dreams and goals?

Oral Report:

Three to Four minutes in length.

Minimum of six Power Point slides on guild and/or family life.

Explain what your guild does and where you live.
